Copies may be obtained by writing to<br/>the authors.Abstract:This paper reports the results of a survey conducted to assess the development impacts<br/>of USAID-supported aquaculture training programs conducted at three institutions of<br/>higher education in Kenya and Thailand. All program participants interviewed reported<br/>that they acquired specific knowledge, skills, and attitudes during the training and that it<br/>has had an important impact on their professional development. The programs have also<br/>had a marked effect on the institutions where the participants now work. Short-term<br/>training in the U.S. and short-term training in one's home country were rated as more<br/>effective training models than long-term training in the U.S.
